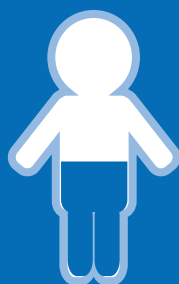

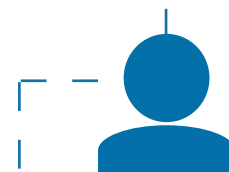

DOMAINS

de Souza courses are informed by four practice standards detailed in the Canadian Association of Nurses in Oncology (CANO/ACIO) Practice Standards and Competencies for the Specialized Oncology Nurse. To obtain your de Souza Designation, you must achieve 4.0 course credits with at least one course completed from each of the four domains.

1

Treatment and Delivery of Evidence Based Care

These courses are about developing skills and knowledge in treating and delivering cancer and palliative care. Course teachings are based on best practices and provincial and Canadian standards.

2

Therapeutic and Supportive Relationships

These courses address engaging in caring relationships with cancer patients and their families. These courses focus on the professional's role in being supportive and sensitive to a patient's changing physical and psychosocial responses.

3

Developing Professional Practice and Leadership

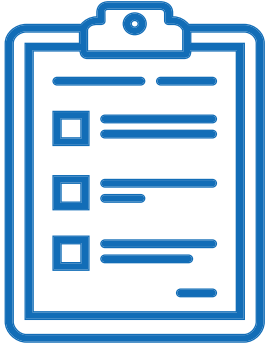
Engaging in critical thinking, integrating best practice and evidence based knowledge, exercising ethical judgment and advocating for change are the foundation of courses under this category.

4

Patient Teaching and Coaching

These courses help health professionals prepare individuals living with cancer and their families to manage the many aspects of the cancer experience. Courses are geared towards helping provide patient education, psychosocial support and counselling.

Patient Navigation (Updated June 2021)



The Patient Navigation course is designed to support health care professionals working with cancer patients or survivors in the hospital or community setting. The 2021 update incorporates CANO 2020 position statement and covers core competencies in patient navigation through case studies to highlight unique challenges in service coordination in each cancer disease site. The course also expands content areas on the importance and the process to improve access for underserved indigenous communities, ethno-cultural and diverse gender groups. Modules include:

- ▶ Information and Education
- ▶ Assessment
- ▶ Communication
- ▶ Screening for Emotional Distress
- ▶ Culture and Diversity
- ▶ Social Support and Resources

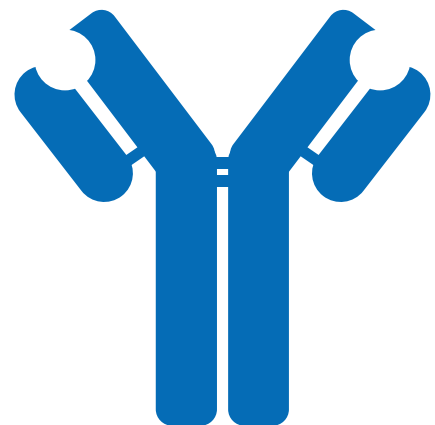

Complex Malignant Hematology

Cancer care is changing rapidly, and no area is changing faster than complex malignant hematology. This is a comprehensive course covering core competency areas in managing hematological malignancies. This course is designed to equip you with the knowledge you need to succeed in this challenging and rewarding subspecialty. It is divided into twelve sections with forty-four modules in total, written by experienced clinical practitioners. Topics include:

- ▶ Multiple Myeloma
- ▶ Lymphoma
- ▶ Leukemia
- ▶ Aplastic Anemia
- ▶ Oncological Emergencies



In addition to nursing-specific courses, de Souza Institute offers courses with an interprofessional focus, which may be of interest to: physicians, social workers, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, pharmacists, spiritual care providers, psychologists and radiation therapists. These courses include:

Interprofessional Psychosocial Oncology Distance Education (IPOSE)

The main mechanisms to facilitate learning in these courses are eLearning, independent study of the course materials and weekly online seminars. A range of innovative learning resources have been developed specifically for these courses, such as case study narratives, video-taped interviews, and dramatizations of individual, family and interprofessional situations. Online discussion boards will be maintained to explore course topics.

1

Interprofessional Psychosocial Oncology: Introduction to Theory and Practice

Psychosocial Oncology is a specialty area of cancer care that is concerned with the myriad of psychological, emotional, social and spiritual responses of persons affected by cancer. This course provides an opportunity for health care professionals to explore common psychosocial issues that individuals and families experience when an adult family member is diagnosed with cancer.

2

Interprofessional Psychosocial Oncology: Sexual Health and Counselling in Prostate Cancer

The purpose of this 12 week course is to equip health care professionals with the skills and knowledge necessary to deliver sexual health support to patients and their partners impacted by prostate cancer. Education, support, and guidance in the development of future prostate cancer specific sexual health programs are also addressed.

3

Sexual Health in Cancer Part 1 & Sex Counselling in Cancer Part 2

The purpose of these two 7 week courses is to assist health care professionals in cancer care to integrate sexual health care in practice. Sexual concerns are one of the most common problems encountered in cancer care settings, yet they are the least likely to be discussed unless asked.

Treatment and Delivery of Evidence-Based Care

Advanced Pain Assessment and Management

Examines the pathophysiology of cancer pain, cancer pain syndromes, pharmacological and non-pharmacological intervention for intractable pain in palliation. Participants will explore methods on how to conduct educational and advocacy work.

Cancer Care Basics

Reviews foundational knowledge and concepts in cancer, current treatments and common side effects. It also addresses issues faced by cancer patients, including sexuality and survivorship. The content is tailored to the needs of clinicians who look after cancer patients in general hospitals and in the community.

Community-based Chemotherapy and Biotherapy

Provides foundational knowledge of chemotherapy and biotherapy when caring for patients in the community. Key topics covered are commonly used drugs, toxicities, accidental spill management, as well as patient and family education. This course was created in collaboration with Ontario Health.

Complex Malignant Hematology

Provides updated knowledge in complex malignant hematology topics including leukemia, lymphoma, multiple myeloma and aplastic anemia. This course also covers advances in Hematopoietic Stem Cell Transplantation (HSCT), highlighting HSCT associated complications/adverse effects and their management, as well as psychosocial and survivorship issues.

Cancer in Pregnancy

This course covers cancer care for patients diagnosed with breast cancer during pregnancy. This course prepares HCPs about to care for a pregnant patients with breast cancer – including genetic considerations, obstetrical and neonatal monitoring, surgery, systemic therapy including supportive drugs, psychosocial support, and lactation support.

Foundations of Cancer Disease Sites

Provides essential concepts for assessment, care and management in a variety of cancer disease sites. Choose the specific sites that are relevant to you and can be taken in any order. The disease sites covered are:

- Lung, colorectal, breast, and prostate (Combined module)
- The following disease sites can be taken individually. Brain, GI, skin, sarcoma disease sites are available now. Kidney, ovarian and cervical cancer will be available for enrolment in spring 2022

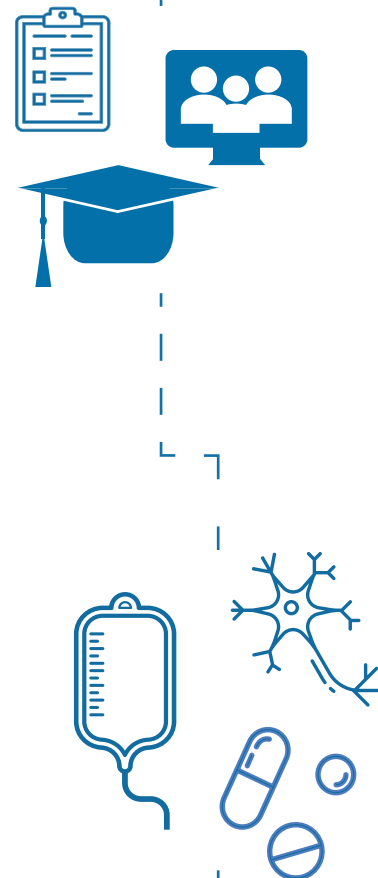
