There is no prerequisite for this course, though a foundational knowledge of cancer, cancer disease sites and principles of treatment is recommended.

## A. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This 8-week online course will introduce nurses to the oncologic emergencies (OE) which may present before, during, or after a cancer diagnosis. These emergencies may be life-threatening, and prompt recognition of signs and symptoms, as well as initiation of prevention strategies or early interventions, are imperative for a positive outcome.

This course will introduce nurses to 7 additional oncologic emergencies.

Although learners can complete the various components of the course at their own pace, the course must be **completed in its entirety** within **eight weeks** of the course start date (this date can be found on the course information page in *My Account*).

## B. COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Define each oncological emergency (OE)
- Discuss normal anatomy, physiology and pathophysiology related to the OE
- Discuss risk factors, signs and symptoms, diagnosis, treatment and prognosis for each OE including any standardized tools available
- Explain the principles of treatment for each OE
- Discuss the role of the nurse in assessment and management of each OE

## C. MODE OF LEARNING: eLearning

The eLearning environment fosters a self-directed approach. You can progress through the modules and exercises at a convenient time, at home or work. The course timetable in Section H on page 6 of the course syllabus outlines weekly expectations for participants.

- Learning and application: Sections and modules were developed by the de Souza education team to reflect the latest knowledge in Oncologic Emergencies. The content is up-to-date and includes interactive application exercises and links to the latest clinical guidelines.

- Study Guides: Each course has a printable study guide that you can print and fill in as you progress through the interactive course modules. Study guides are optional but can be a helpful reference for when the course is over.

#### D. MODES OF EVALUATION

As part of the evaluation process, you are required to complete the following:

She is currently an advanced practice nurse educator at the de Souza Institute. Philiz has always believed in teaching and mentoring nurses and other health professionals to provide the best quality patient care for people and their caregivers experiencing cancer.

## Donald MacDonald

Donald MacDonald has been an oncology nurse for 50 years, 35 years working in clinical oncology at Mount Sinai Hospital in Toronto, and the last 15 as an educator at de Souza. In 2014, she received the CANO-ACIO Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2023, she was the recipient of the Pfizer Award of Excellence in Nursing Education.
