Esther Green was the former Provincial Head of Nursing and Psychosocial Oncology at Cancer Care Ontario, and one of the key architects of the de Souza Institute. She, along with other experts in the field, felt there was a lack of specialized education in cancer nursing across the country.

"There was no consistency in the course material and often courses were taught by individuals who may not have had oncology experience," she says. "This is a highly specialized field and it was essential that we had a program and curriculum that addressed these gaps."

Within a short space of time, de Souza exceeded all expectations. "There were a lot of nay-sayers at the beginning who said an innovative curriculum design was not going to work," Green says. "They thought nurses wouldn't go online."

Instead, the de Souza team delivered.

"What de Souza believes, and what nurses understand, is that the primary purpose of specialized training is to better serve patients. What matters most are patients."

CHARISSA CORDON HIGHEST STANDARD OF LEARNING

Charissa Cordon is a Registered Nurse and the Chief of Interprofessional Practice at Juravinski Cancer Centre in Hamilton. She first became involved with de Souza in 2008, as an educator at the Princess Margaret Cancer Centre. She noticed that there was no educational support for nurses to write the national oncology specialty exam. She approached de Souza to build a curriculum for her group.

"In our first year, we had 87 participants, and an over 80% success rate," she says. While leading a collaborative practice at St. Joseph's Hospital in early 2015, she made it a requirement that her nurses complete de Souza's Foundation for Oncology Nursing Practice course and the Standardized Chemotherapy course. "Having the nurses taking de Souza courses – the highest standard of learning – means that they will have the best knowledge to provide high quality care." "de Souza training means that clinicians will work closely with each other to identify potential service gaps and plan the best ways to improve patient care."





In Canada, there are national standards and guidelines, however, the service delivery in cancer and palliative care is often variable because each health care organization applies these guidelines in its own way. Without access to specific, specialized training, health care professionals are often left without the knowledge of best practices or the decision support tools they need to be effective in care.

DR. LINDA PATRICK DE SOUZA EDUCATION IN ADVANCED PRACTICE

Dr. Patrick is the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing at the University of Windsor. In 2010, she became interested in using the de Souza Institute's unique programming to augment nursing education. "Nurses at the undergraduate level are not prepared for specialization," she says. "We have a hospice in Windsor and nurses learn a lot there, after graduation. We also know that they need to be supported continuously throughout their career."

The partnership between the University of Windsor and the de Souza Institute has led to a graduate diploma in advanced oncology/palliative care, a first of its kind in Canada, setting higher standard in specialized training at the graduate level. "There's a sense of pride among de Souza nurses," says Patrick. "The care is exceptional. de Souza courses are constantly being updated, and they are standardized across the province. I'm not sure that each individual hospital would be able to implement the same standards and education."

In the past few years, our numbers exploded: in 2014 alone, enrolment in our courses tripled. We educated more than 7,000 health care professionals across the province, in areas urban and rural. For nurses specializing in cancer care or palliative care who have earned a Master's Degree.
