A. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course highlights the care of multiple myeloma, lymphoma, and leukemia providing comprehensive information about incidence, pathophysiology, and risk factors for developing these hematological malignancies. Diagnosis, treatment and follow up care is discussed in detail and provide learners with essential knowledge for the care of patients with hematological malignancies.

There are **14 modules** in the course and **3 cases quizzes**. The quizzes consist of a case study for each disease site (multiple myeloma, lymphoma, leukemia) where you will apply your knowledge to the care of three individual patients; one per disease site.

Although you can complete the various components of the course at your own pace, you must complete the course within **8 weeks** of your course registration date (this date can be found on the course information page in *My Account*).

C. COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Identify the etiology, epidemiology, risk factors, and pathophysiology of multiple myeloma, lymphoma, and leukemia.
- Outline the diagnosis and staging for multiple myeloma, lymphoma and leukemia.
- Describe the current management and treatment modalities for multiple myeloma, lymphoma and leukemia.
- Describe the nursing role and considerations for caring for patients with multiple myeloma, lymphoma and leukemia.
- Teach patients (and their families/caregivers) self-management strategies for living with multiple myeloma, lymphoma and leukemia.

D. MODE OF LEARNING: eLearning

The eLearning environment fosters a self-directed, self-paced, asynchronous approach..

- <u>eLearning Modules</u>: Sections and modules reflect the latest knowledge in complex malignant hematology, include interactive application exercises and links to the latest clinical guidelines.
- **Study Guides:** Each course section has a fillable study guide that you can fill electronically or print and fill in as you progress through the interactive course modules.

E. MODES OF EVALUATION

As part of the evaluation process, you are required to complete the following:

- A Baseline Participant Survey: assesses your knowledge, attitude, and confidence before you begin the eLearning modules for the course.
- eLearning Modules: complete all 14 modules by the course end date.
- <u>Case Study Based Quizzes</u>: There is a final case-based quiz for each disease site. Each disease site quiz consists of 8-10 multiple choice questions. You must receive a grade of at least 75% to pass. You have **two attempts** at each quiz to achieve a passing grade.
- <u>Learner Evaluations</u>: At the end of each section, you will be required to complete a "Learner Evaluation" where you can provide your feedback on whether the content met your professional practice needs. These surveys are facilitated electronically through eLearning.

When you have successfully completed the above requirements, you will receive **13.5 learning hours**, **0.25 de Souza credits** towards obtaining your de Souza designation, and an email containing instructions on how to download your **certificate of completion** via your "My Account".

F. EXPECTATIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

You will need 2-3 hours a week minimum to complete the course on time. Track your course completion by viewing the 'completion progress' in the upper right hand corner of the course screen. Course extensions are not permitted, however in the case of unexpected illness see section K for a link to policy for accommodation.
